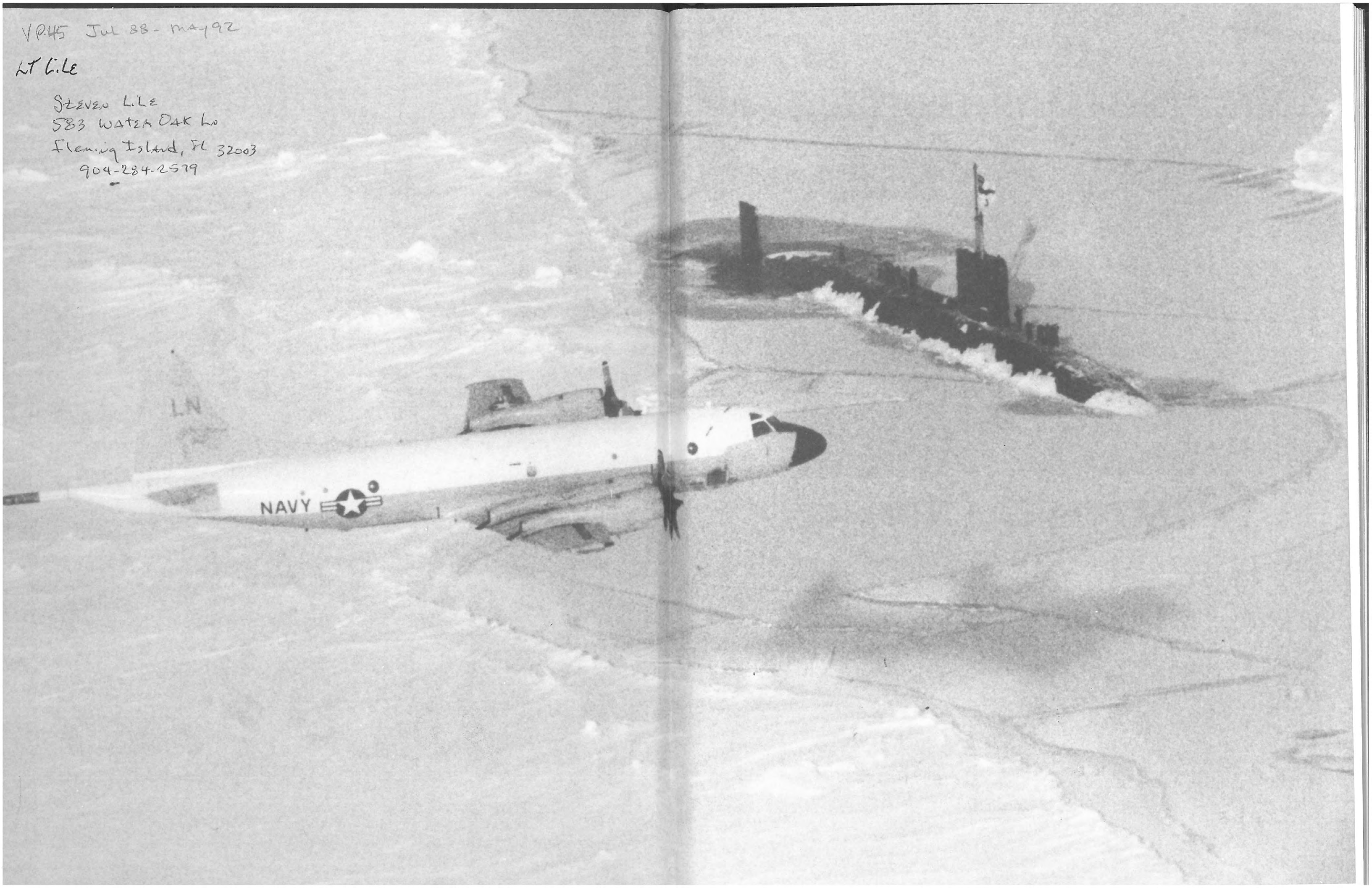

COMMANDING OFFICER

CDR. A. A. EFRAIMSON

A native of Syracuse New York, Commander Efraimson enlisted into the United States Navy in 1966. As an Aviation Fire Control Technician with Attack Squadron THIRTY-SEVEN (VA-37), he completed cruises aboard the **USS KITTY HAWK (CV-63)** in 1968-1969 and **USS SARATOGA (CV-60)** in 1970.

Upon completion of his enlistment, he attended Syracuse University, graduating in 1973 with a Bachelors of Science Degree in Management. Returning to the Navy, he attended Aviation Officer Candidate School in Pensacola, Florida, was commissioned an Ensign in October 1973 and

was designated as a Naval Aviator in 1974.

Commander Efraimson's next assignment was with Patrol Squadron FIFTY-SIX (VP-56) in Jacksonville, Florida and included deployments to Keflavik, Iceland and Sigonella, Sicily.

In March of 1978 he reported to Patrol Squadron THIRTY, also in Jacksonville. He served as Instructor Pilot, Communications Officer, and Quality Assurance Officer.

From July 1983 to July 1985, he served as Enlisted Air Crew and New Construction Rating Assignment Officer at the Naval Military Personnel Command (N-404) in Washington, D.C.

Following refresher training at Patrol Squadron THIRTY, he reported in February of 1986 to Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE, where he was the Safety/NATOPS Officer and Maintenance Officer. During this tour, he deployed to Bermuda and Sigonella, Sicily. Upon completion of his tour with Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE in June 1988, he reported to NAS Bermuda as Executive Officer.

Commander Efraimson reported aboard Patrol Squadron FIFTY-SIX (VP-56) in October 1990 and assumed the duties as Executive Officer until April 1991 when he became the Commanding Officer of Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE. Commander Efraimson has been awarded the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (with gold star) and various other service awards.

COMMANDING OFFICER

CDR. R. B. BRANNON

Commander Brannon is a native of Corsicana, Texas. He enlisted in the Navy at the age of 17, in 1968, and spent four years in Southern California as a plane captain and avionics technician on F-4's, earning his Aircrew Wings as a SAR crewman in H-3's. Selected for the NESEP scholarship and commissioning program in 1972, he attended Purdue University, graduating in 1975 with honors in mathematics and Russian. He was commissioned an Ensign at Newport, Rhode Island in August 1975, commenced flight training, and was designated a Naval Flight Officer in February 1977.

After completion of Fleet Replacement Squadron VP-31, at Moffett Field, California in July 1977, Commander Brannon was assigned to Patrol Squadron ONE (VP-1) homeported at Barbers Point, Hawaii. He served as Public Affairs Officer, Avionics Branch Officer, and AW Division Officer, participating in deployments to Cubi Point, Diego Garcia, Japan, and Guam.

In July 1980, Commander Brannon reported to the staff of the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, as a Flag Lieutenant.

In October 1982, after completion of required training in shiphandling and seamanship, Commander Brannon reported to **USS MIDWAY (CV-41)** homeported in Yokosuka, Japan, as Assistant Navigator. During his tour, the ship completed numerous deployments, including the North Pacific, Sea of Japan, Philippine Sea, and Indian Oceans. Additionally, the ship was awarded her third consecutive Battle "E", and Commander Brannon completed qualifications as Officer of the Deck (Underway), and Surface Warfare Officer.

In November 1984, he was reassigned to Patrol Squadron THIRTY (VP-30), where he served as Admin Officer and NFO Instructor.

Commander Brannon reported to Patrol Squadron FIVE (VP-5) in February 1987, serving as Tactics Officer and Operations Officer. During his tour, the Mad Foxes completed a highly successful deployment to Sigonella, Sicily, establishing a new record for ASW contact in the Mediterranean, and receiving the COMSIXTHFLT Hook 'em Award for superior ASW achievement.

Since departing VP-5 in August 1988, Commander Brannon has completed assignments at the National Defense University (ICAF) in Washington, DC (during which time he participated in an exchange visit to the Soviet Union), and at Patrol Wing ELEVEN as the Assistant Operations Officer. He reported to VP-45 in March 1990 for duty as Executive Officer and became Commanding Officer in April 1992.

Commander Brannon's personal awards include the Navy Commendation Medal (with three gold stars), the Navy Achievement Medal (with one gold star), the Meritorious Unit Commendation, and various other unit and general service awards.

Commander Brannon is married to the former Stella Diana Boone, a native of Atherton, California. They reside in Orange Park with their daughter, Nicki. Another daughter, Stefanie lives in Honolulu, Hawaii, and a son, Christopher, lives in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER

CDR. R. W. ELLIOTT

Commander Elliott is a native of Lubbock, Texas. He attended the University of Texas at El Paso, graduating with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in English Literature and Philosophy.

In August 1975, he reported to Aviation Officer Candidate School and was commissioned an Ensign in December 1975. Upon completion of flight training in December 1976, he was designated Naval Aviator.

In July 1977 after completion of P3 FRS Training with Patrol Squadron THIRTY (VP-30), Commander Elliott joined Patrol Squadron SIXTEEN (VP-16) at NAS Jacksonville, Florida. He served as Paraloft Branch Officer, Aircraft Division Officer, and Pilot NATOPS Officer, completing one deployment to Keflavik, Iceland and two deployments to Sigonella, Sicily.

In November 1980 Commander Elliott reported to Patrol Squadron THIRTY (VP-30) as an Instructor Pilot. He served as Powerplants Branch Officer, Aircraft Division Officer, and



Pilot Training Officer.

Subsequently, Commander Elliott received orders to report as Aide/Flag Lieutenant to the Commander Middle East Forces embarked onboard the **USS LASALLE**, homeported in Bahrain.

In March 1985 Commander Elliott commenced studies at the Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island, receiving Masters of Arts degrees in National Security and Strategic Studies as well as in Business Management from Salve Regina College. He then reported to the staff of Commander, Patrol Wing ELEVEN as the Safety Officer and Officer in Charge of the first Mobile Operations Command Center (MOCC) detachment.

In June 1988 Commander Elliott reported to Patrol Squadron FIFTY-SIX (VP-56) and deployed to Sigonella, Sicily. While a "Dragon", he served as Training Officer, Officer in Charge Detachment Norway, and Operations Officer.

In October 1989 Commander Elliott reported to Patrol Squadron THIRTY as the Training Officer and in March 1991 he transferred to Commander, Patrol Wing ELEVEN serving as the Operations Officer.

Commander Elliott's personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal (two awards), Navy Achievement Medal (two awards) and various other unit and service awards. He is married to the former Deborah A. Hoffman of Atlanta, Georgia. They reside in Orange Park with daughter Jennifer and a son Matthew.

COMMAND MASTER CHIEF

AVCM R. A. HAGER

AVCM R. Hager began his naval career in December 1966, by his enlistment in the Delayed Entry Program. He reported to boot camp in San Diego, California April 1967, from Wiesbaden, West Germany, where his father, a career Air Force Chief Master Sergeant, was stationed. After attending AT "A" School at NATTC Memphis, he served his first duty assignment with the "Hellrazors" of VA-174 at NAS Cecil Field as an electronics maintenance technician on A-7A, A-7B, and A-7E model aircraft. He next joined the "Clansmen" of VA-46 and made a Mediterranean cruise onboard the **USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CV-67)**. It was during this cruise, precipitated by the 1970 Jordanian Crisis, that he first re-enlisted in Valetta, Malta, for orders to AVIC "B" School at Memphis, he was accepted for duty involving flight and reported to Inflight Technician Training at VP-30, Patuxent River.

In August 1972, Master Chief Hager reported to VP-45 at NAS Jacksonville and completed the first P-3 "Charlie" deployment to Sigonella in October 1973. Following deployment to Keflavik in 1974, he received orders to CTF-67 Detachment Rota and became a "Plank Owner" at Tactical Support Center (now ASWOC), Rota, Spain. In May 1978, he reported to the "Batcave" of VP-24 at NAS Jacksonville where he remained on sea duty for seven and a half years, making two deployments to Sigonella, two deployments to Bermuda, and one each to Keflavik, and Rota-Lajes. After an abbreviated tour of shore duty in VP-30, he returned to the "Pelican's Nest" in April 1988 and assumed the duties of Command Master Chief.

Master Chief Hager's personal awards and ribbons include the Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation with three bronze stars, United States Coast Guard Meritorious Unit Commendation with Operational Device, Navy Expeditionary Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon with silver star, Navy and Marine Corps Overseas Service Ribbon, and the Special Operations Service Ribbon.

Master Chief Hager and his wife, the former Rosemary Vonderhaar of Montgomery, Alabama, have two incomes, no children, and reside in Orange Park with their Dachshund Fritz.

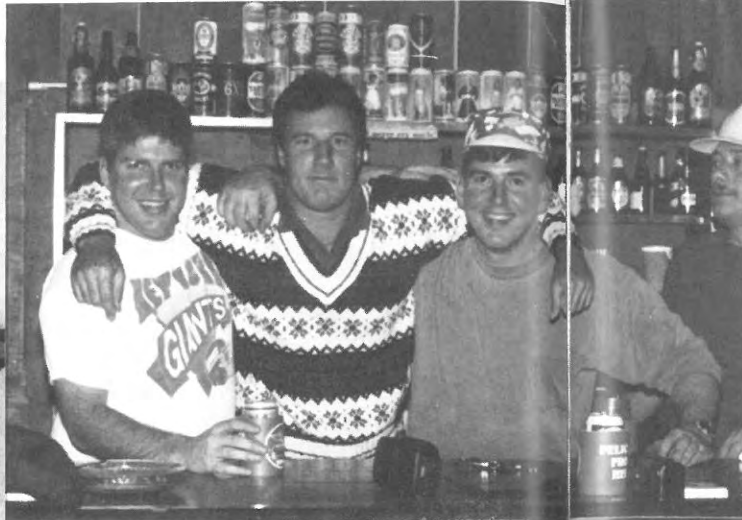
