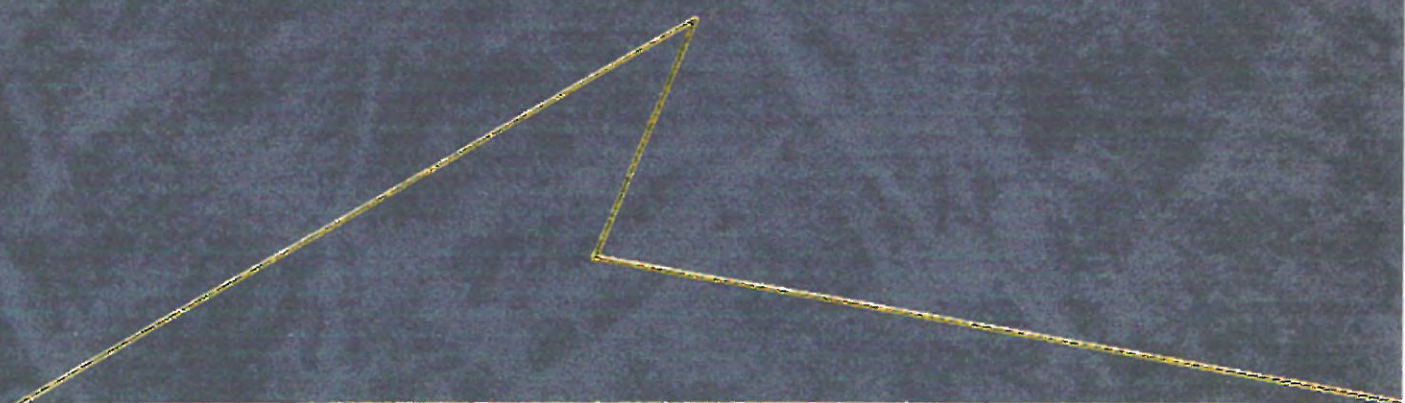

Commander Stevens is a native of Waverly, Iowa. Upon completion of two years in the U.S. Army he attended the University of Northern Iowa graduating in June 1976 with a Bachelor of Art Degree in Accounting.

In July 1976, he attended Aviation Officer Candidate School in Pensacola, Florida and was commissioned as Ensign in November 1976. He was designated a Naval Flight Officer in 1978.

In September 1978, after completion of Fleet Replacement Squadron THIRTY-ONE (VP-31), at Moffett Field, California, Commander Stevens was assigned to Patrol Squadron FORTY (VP-40). He served as Human Resources Officer, Communication Officer, Avionics and Armament Division Officer and NFO Training Officer. He deployed to Kadena and Misawa, Japan and Adak, Alaska.

In December 1981, Commander Stevens reported to the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California and received a Master of Science degree in Financial Management in June 1983.

Commander Stevens next tour of duty was with the Cost Analysis Division of Naval Air Systems Command in Washington, DC. He ved as the was the cost analyst for the P-3 Program and was selected to be the Senior Cost Analyst for the CV ASW Helicopter Source ction team.

n June 1987, Commander Stevens reported to the USS ENTERPRISE (CVN 65) at Naval Air Station Alameda, California, serving in Operations Department. Deployed with USS ENTERPRISE in 1988 for a seven month around the world cruise as the Assistant Com-Display Center Officer earning Tactical Action Officer (TAO) qualification. In December 1989, he attended Armed Forces Staff College Norfolk, Virginia, graduating in June 1990.

Commander Stevens reported to Patrol Squadron NINE (VP-9) in March 1991, serving as Assistant Maintenance Officer and Operations ficer. During his tour, VP-9 deployed to Misawa, Japan, and was awarded the Battle E for operational excellence. Upon tour completion, reported to NAS Moffett Field as Base Comptroller.

n September 1991, Commander Stevens reported to the office of the Comptroller of the Navy in Washington D.C. as Congressional Liai- for the Appropriation Subcommittee on Defense.

Commander Stevens then reported to Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE (VP-45) in 1993 as the Executive Officer and in 1994 assumed mmand.

Commander Stevens' personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (with two gold stars) and var- s other unit and general service awards. He is married to the former Barbara Bickle of Central City, Iowa. They have three children: Troy, ky, and David.

Commander Meyerriecks is a native of Huntington, New York. He attended the University of Florida, graduating in June of 1975. He was commissioned an Ensign through the Naval Aviation Officer Candidate program in Pensacola, Florida in October 1977.

Upon completion of Navy Flight Training, at Corpus Christi, Texas, he was selectively retained as a Flight Instructor and assigned to VT27. He taught initial flight training, precision aerobatics and formation flying in the T-28. His next tour of duty was with Patrol Squadron SEVENTEEN (VP-17) at NAS Barbers Point, Hawaii. He completed two deployments to NAS Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines, and one split deployment to Adak, Alaska and NAF Diego Garcia, BIOT, where he was designated a Patrol Plane Commander, Instructor Pilot and Mission Commander in the P-3 aircraft.

In February 1984, Commander Meyerriecks reported to Patrol Squadron THIRTY-ONE (VP-31) at NAS Moffett Field, California, as a Fleet Replacement Squadron Instructor Pilot. He assumed duties as Pilot NATOPS Officer and conducted the Patrol Plane Instructor Pilot Course, authored a Flight Training Guide for non-instructor pilots and developed a Dive Flying seminar enhancing flight station safety. He completed this tour as the Commander Naval Air Pacific, NATOPS Pilot Eval for the P-3 aircraft.

In November 1986, Commander Meyerriecks reported to the USS KITTY HAWK (CV 63) in San Diego, California, as the ship's Communications Officer. He deployed in 1987 for an around-the-world cruise, where he earned the qualification as UNREP Conning Officer Underway, and CDO Underway.

In July 1989, Commander Meyerriecks reported to Commander Patrol Wing TEN (CPW-10) Moffett Field, California, where he served as the ASWOC Director. While assigned to Patrol Wing TEN he was selected as the Junior Officer of the Year (1989) by the Santa Clara County Council Navy League of the United States.

Commander Meyerriecks joined Patrol Squadron FORTY-EIGHT (VP-48) in November 1990. There he served as Training Officer, deployed to NAS Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines. Patrol Squadron FORTY-EIGHT was disestablished and he subsequently joined Patrol Squadron FORTY (VP-40) as the Operations Officer, and deployed to NAF Misawa, Japan.

In November 1991, Commander Meyerriecks reported to the Bureau of Naval Personnel, Washington, DC, as the VP Air Combat Element Officer. In April 1994, Commander Meyerriecks reported to Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE as the Executive Officer and in 1995 became the Commanding Officer.

Commander Meyerriecks is married to the former Margee P. Stout of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. They have two sons, Russell and T

CDR K. W. DEUTSCH

Commander Kenneth William Deutsch is a native of Burlington, Illinois. He attended Illinois State University, graduating in June 1978, and received his commission in August 1978 through the Aviation Reserve Officer Candidate (AVROC) Program. In July 1979, Commander Deutsch was designated a Naval Flight Officer.

In February of 1980, Commander Deutsch joined Patrol Squadron SIXTEEN and completed deployments to Sigonella, Sicily; Bermuda/Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines; and Rota, Spain/Lajes, Azores.

Commander Deutsch reported in July 1983 to Patrol Squadron THIRTY, the Fleet Replacement Squadron, where he served as Communications Officer, Tactical Training Team (TTT) Instructor, and NFO Training Officer.

In July 1986, Commander Deutsch reported to Commander, Battle Force Seventh Fleet/Commander, Carrier Group FIVE, home-ported in Cubi Point, Republic of the Philippines, where he served as Flag Secretary and Flag Lieutenant. While onboard the staff, he qualified as Flag Tactical Action Officer and served on several flagships, including USS MIDWAY (CV 41) and USS RANGER (CV 61). In September 1987, the Carrier Group FIVE staff became the first Joint Task Force Middle East staff on which Commander Deutsch served as Flag Lieutenant for the Commander, completing a six month deployment to the Arabian Gulf and the Indian Ocean onboard USS LONG BEACH (CGN 9) and USS IOWA (BB 61) during the Iran/Iraq War and Operation Earnest Will.

Following the tour in the Philippines, he was assigned in August 1988 to the Bureau of Naval Personnel in Washington, DC where he served as the VP Shore and then Sea Detailer in the Aviation Assignment Branch. In November 1990, Commander Deutsch joined Patrol Squadron FIVE (VP-5) where he served as Assistant Maintenance Officer and Maintenance Officer, completing a Rota/Lajes deployment. Upon completion of this tour in February 1992, he reported to Patrol Wing ELEVEN (CPW-11) where he served as Operations Officer until January 1994.

Commander Deutsch then reported to Patrol Squadron TWENTY-FOUR (VP-24) in May 1994 as the Executive Officer until their decommissioning. In April 1995, he reported as the Executive Officer of Patrol Squadron FORTY-FIVE (VP-45).

Commander Deutsch's awards include the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (6), National Defense Service Medal (2), Southwest Asia Service Medal (with Bronze Star), Joint Meritorious Unit Award, U.S. Coast Guard Meritorious Unit Commendation, Navy Achievement Medal (2), Navy Commendation Medal (4), and Navy and Marine Corps Overseas Service Ribbon.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Roman A. Deutsch of Burlington, Illinois, Commander Deutsch is married to the former Kay Lynn Thompson of Elgin, Illinois and they have two children, Kyle and Kaitlyn.

AWCM Robert D. Rogers began his naval career in April 1969, with his enlistment in the Delayed Entry Program. In May he reported to boot camp in Orlando, Florida from Troy, Alabama. After attending AW A School at NATTC Memphis, he served his first duty assignment with the Shamrocks of Helicopter Squadron SEVEN at NAS Quonset Point, Rhode Island, as a search and rescue swimmer and Sonar Operator in the SH-3D helicopter. He made a six month deployment to the Mediterranean and a ten month deployment off the coast of Vietnam aboard USS SARATOGA (CV60).

At the completion of his first tour he joined the reserves of HS- 75 in South Weymouth, Massachusetts. In August 1976, he reported back to active duty with Helicopter Squadron SEVEN once again; where he made another Mediterranean deployment. At the completion of the two year tour he received orders to the Helicopter Squadron ONE Seahorses as an Aircrew Instructor.

In August of 1981, Master Chief Rogers reported to the Nightdippers of Helicopter Squadron FIVE. While there he deployed aboard the USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER (CV-69) which stood off the coast of Beirut, Lebanon during the marine barracks attack. He received his Associate of Arts Degree and was advanced to Chief Petty Officer during this tour.

At the completion of his HS-5 tour he returned once again to Helicopter Squadron ONE as an Instructor and CNAL NATOPS Evaluator. During this tour he received his Bachelors degree and was advanced to Senior Chief Petty Officer.

In September 1987, Master Chief Rogers was detailed to report to the Batcave of Patrol Squadron TWENTY-FOUR via training in VP-30. While in VP-24 he deployed to Bermuda and Sigonella, Sicily where he served as Operations Leading Chief Petty Officer.

In September 1989, he was advanced to Master Chief Petty Officer and transferred to Patrol Squadron THIRTY. While there, he served as Training Department Leading Chief Petty Officer, Command Master Chief for six months and manpower coordinator for the consolidation to a single-site training command. He became a member of the Pelican Team in March 1994 where he serves as Command Master Chief.

Master Chief Rogers' personal awards and ribbons include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Achievement Medal with three gold stars, Navy Unit Commendation, Meritorious Unit Commendation with bronze star, three Battle E awards, Good Conduct with four bronze stars, Navy Expeditionary Medal, National Defense Service Medal with bronze star, Vietnam Service Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon with four bronze stars, Coast Guard Special Operations Ribbon and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

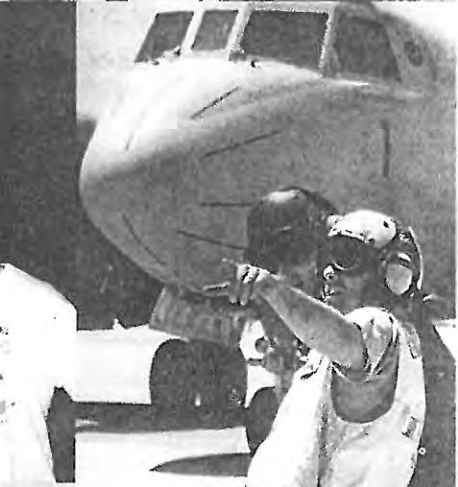
